SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, many more speeches of that kind by Senator Hall, if something would happen to his wife, then something would definitely happen to Tim, and his daughter would be Little Orphan Annie. Be careful, Senator Hall. Members of the Legislature, Senator Moore, Senator Moore, you remind me of myself when I was a kid. But I'd like to ask you a question.
