That's not to indicate that I would necessarily, at this point, throw in the towel and say that the penny sales tax on motor vehicles that was raised as a result of 1059 that is currently going into the Highway Trust Fund is not a worthy source of finding that revenue. In looking early in the session when we were trying to find places to fund the teacher-salary issue, this was, quite frankly, the most logical spot that I could see, more logical than taking it out of the sales and income tax increase that funded LB 1059. So I am going to be opposing the indefinitely postpone motion for reasons that I think 1272 is in shape that I can support. Even if it's not in shape for you to support now but you would like to see other things worked out, certainly killing a bill is not a way of bringing cooler heads together and finding some sort of agreement. So I would urge you to defeat the IPP motion, advance the bill and then work on some other source of funding, if that is your desire. Thank you.
