It would be a big mistake, in terms of the term limitation petition that is out there, for us not to do something very significant this year to show the public that we are, in fact, making a good faith effort with regard to campaign reform and...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...and with regard to the whole effort of legislative performance. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Mr. Speaker.
