What we have to keep in mind throughout all of this is that these so called maximums, these so called limits are like the suggested retail price you see on automobile stickers, they don't mean anything.

PRESIDENT MOUL: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: In fact it reminds me of something that was going on in a trial, since I only have a minute. There was a guy who was referred to as Colonel testifying, and the judge leaned over and was being contemptuous. He said, why do they call you Colonel? Were you in the Korean war? He said, no. The judge said, well, you're not old enough to have been in the second World War, so what does Colonel before your name mean? The guy looked up at the judge, he said, judge, it don't mean nothing, just like the Honorable, or Honor in front of your name don't mean nothing. In the same way that the Colonel meant nothing, that Honor meant nothing, these limits mean nothing. But since we're going to have nothing limits, let's give the same nothing limit to Senator Johnson, under his amendment, that we're giving to all the other candidates for these offices.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Wesely, do you wish to speak to the amendment? Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Madam President, members, I would urge you to support the amendment of Senator Johnson. It doesn't make any real sense for me to represent 3,200 people, and he represents 320,000 people, and for me to be getting 5,000 and Senator Johnson to be getting 2,000, or whatever. I would urge your support. I run my campaign on the basis that I would support any type of campaign restriction, funding and so on. I hope the senators would scrutinize this bill and look into it and find any other discrepancies that might come to their light, as this one here. I think we need to support this and go on. Thank you.
