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SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Rod Johnson.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members, my two amendments, this one and the next one coming were both filed as perceived technical amendments and if Senator Morrissey has any objection, I would be happy to facilitate any concerns he might have. But the first amendment is basically saying that we will be consistent with Subtitle D requirements on deadlines so that the state is not setting one deadline that may be more stringent or more loose than the...than...well, I guess we can't do it less than what the DEC...or the Subtitle D requirements, but basically saying let's stay consistent with what Subtitle D is telling us. Let's not make those dates unreasonable and just have some consistency out there for our municipalities. I'm just concerned that we're going to push our municipalities and our counties to meet deadlines that will possibly be unrealistic or difficult to meet. That is all that this particular amendment does. Again, just trying to keep consistent with some of the deadlines that have been suggested to us under Subtitle D requirements. So, Senator Morrissey, if you have any problems, please let me know at this point. I don't have any real strong opinions about it but I think, for a level of consistency with our municipalities and our counties to comply with Subtitle D, I think it's important that we have some stability in the system and not different dates under DEC rules as opposed to Subtitle D rules and deadlines.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Rod Johnson. Anyone wishing to address this amendment by Senator Rod Johnson? Senator Chambers, did you wish to address this amendment? Anyone wish to address this amendment? Seeing none, Senator Rod Johnson, do you wish to close? He waives closing. We will now vote on the amendment to the committee amendments by Senator Rod Johnson. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.
