

October 1, '93 date for counties and munies to file plans only need relate to capacity assurance. Again, for capacity assurance, they can go to the state plan and the documents provided by that to look at the data on waste flows and waste production in their areas and plan for 20 years into the future. Section 32 establishes requirements for the integrated solid waste plans that are to be filed with the department. The most significant of those requirements include a certification of capacity for existing facilities for waste generated within each solid waste jurisdiction area and for waste generated outside each jurisdiction area that is deposited within each area. An incorporation of the waste management hierarchy, the waste reduction goals, a statement indicating to what extent solid waste generated in this jurisdiction area can be recycled, and a provision for recycling, a recycling program. Again, we are getting our landfills constructed, new facilities, but we are also mandating that they look to the future and look to changing their waste system so we have a smaller and progressively smaller and smaller amounts of waste going into those landfills. Thirty-three prohibits dumping of solid waste in any place other than a licensed facility approved by the department. Again, the farmers will no longer be able to dump on their land, once the system...but at the same time the system will be in place to serve them. The committee amendments provide an effective date, October 1, '93 for this section. In addition, the committee amendments allow the department the flexibility to regulate waste disposal to protect the environment, yet permit a permit program with regulation for other facilities, such as composting and transfer stations that are not as stringent as those for landfills. The amendment also allow, through rule and reg, the ability to dispose of some types of waste on personal property, which could include some farm wastes, such as dead animals which need to be buried before the rendering truck shows up, or debris from possibly dismantled farm buildings. Section 34 authorizes the Environmental Control Council to adopt rules and regs for the permit program for facilities. The committee amendments clarify that the department's permit program will cover other solid waste management facilities other than landfills and the committee amendments also clarify the requirements for financial assurances for closure and postclosure care and monitoring apply only to landfills. We're requiring that they set up a fund to address closure way before closure takes place. Again, we're long-term planning and looking into the future. Section 35 exempts counties and munies and agencies from the local approval provisions from LB 813 of last year, Senator Beutler's siting
