SPEAKER BAACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes. And they are going to do a lot of talking about the impoverishment of the area that I represent as a justification for that. The city, Senator Hartnett, has talked about various problems in our community, mine I'm talking about, to get money through grants and other monies from the government and private associations and then the money goes somewhere else. And I'm just not going to let it happen easily. Senator Morrissey may get his bill, but it's not going to be easy sledding. And I'm just stating how deeply I feel about this issue, how important it is to the people that I represent. And I'm asking that you adopt this amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. We'll now vote on the amendment offered by Senator Chambers. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? This is the last call. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 11 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: It is adopted. Do you have items for the record, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: I do, Mr. President. Mr. President, your Committee on
