CLERK: 15 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is under call. Would all unexcused senators please return to the Chamber and record their presence. All unauthorized personnel must leave the floor. Would the senators please check in, the house is under call. We are accepting call-in votes on the committee amendments.

CLERK: Senator Wesely voting yes.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We do have a request now for a roll call vote, so would the senators please check in. The house is under call. Senator Dennis Byars, Senator Wickersham, Senator Horgan, please check in. We are still looking for Senator Horgan and Senator Byars. Senator Johnson, both of the senators are on their way. We will proceed with roll call vote on this section of the committee amendments. I will remind the senators that the house is under call. Would the senators please be seated. Please proceed, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 1569-70 of the Legislative Journal.) 27 ayes, 10 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment...this section of the amendment is adopted. I will raise the call. Proceed with the final section.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Madam President, I am sorry, I didn't know you recognized me. I have no further problems with the bill. I tried to separate out the two sections of the bill that I had the most concern with. I still have concerns with Section 33, primarily because I am not sure what a farmer or a rural constituent is going to do with his or her waste. If you are closing, on the one end you are closing a lot of the unlicensed landfills in Nebraska, and yet no new landfills have actually been built or you have no access to such as a private landfill, it is going to be very difficult, I think, for some people to meet that requirement in the short period of time that is in this bill now. However, getting to the rest of the portions of the committee amendment, I would stand to say I have no problems with that. I will try and come up with some alternative language to Section 33, but the rest of the bill I can live with.
