This bill says that while you're doing this mediating you talk about religion and they talked about a number of other specific things that no lawyer today would have put into a decree, so what this bill is doing is setting up a long list of things that people are going to be told to listen to when they come to this mediator who has been put in the position of a parent and they in the position of children. I was talking to Senator Beutler about this earlier and told him what it reminded me of. Senator Hillman, when I was growing up, I read the Bible a lot and you see how much good it did me, can't you, so they probably ought to put it off-limits for all children. But, at any rate, when Moses went up on Mount Sinai, he supposedly, if the story's true, and I don't know because I'm old but not that old and, if I were, I probably wouldn't have been there because this was a private conference between Moses and God, at least that's what he said. So if we accept the word of Moses, he talked to Jehovah face to face. Even though the Bible said that, if you look, anybody who saw God's face would die, Moses didn't die. He came down from Mount Sinai with two tables of stone, with the Ten Commandments. His people had become heathenish and had set up a golden calf to worship because they said Moses is gone. They probably had known that...it's repute, alleged that if you look at God you'll die so they figured that since they talked, he looked at God, he's dead and he's not coming back, so built a calf to protect them.
