ASSISTANT CLERK: Next amendment I have to the committee amendments if offered by Senator Chambers. (Senator Chambers' amendment FA335 appears on page 1609 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Clerk, would you read this one so I'll be sure that it's the one that I'm going to discuss. Is that on page 7...well, would you read it, please.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Yes, on page 7, line 6, strike "notwithstanding" and insert "except for"; on line 8 strike "all" and insert "no"; and on line 11 strike "not".

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Before I discuss this amendment, I want to ask a question of Senator Kristensen.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Kristensen, would you respond please?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: I think so, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Not on this amendment. I haven't...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ..talked about it yet.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: On the other one we just voted because it kind of ties into this because what I'm amending goes again to this material. A person under the law has to report child abuse if they know about it. Is that correct?
