

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, since those were the most obnoxious parts of the bill that I saw, and some of the other things can be dealt with on Select File, if the bill advances, and I'm not going to vote to advance it, and I'm still opposed to it because of the some things in it, I have asked Senator Ashford would he agree to an amendment that would say that the mediator would give warning or advise the parties to this mediation that...and we're going to put the language together, anything they say can be used against them. But we will get the language correct. That can either be attempted as an amendment to the committee amendments, or I can just go ahead and wait until you adopt the committee amendments, then make it an amendment to the bill. I'll ask Senator Ashford a question.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Abboud, you're next.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker, I was going to...

SPEAKER BAACK: Oh, excuse me, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...ask Senator Ashford a question (interrupted).

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Ashford, would you respond, please.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Ashford, has...have I correctly represented your position that you would not be opposed to the moder...the mediator advising these parties of his or her obligation to report these items, should they come up in the mediation process?

SENATOR ASHFORD: I don't have a problem. I think if we limit it to that...to that Section 8, to the abuse part of it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I would...I would make it follow that sentence.

SENATOR ASHFORD: Fine, as long as it refers to that sentence, I don't have any problem with it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, because that's the one that bothers me right now.
