

Senator Peterson for closing.

SENATOR PETERSON: Madam President and members, I hope you people got the message on this, that it does not only affect Senator Schrock and myself, but the whole body in here, because you're going, if this passes, you're going to be representing all new...your all new district, which is not necessary. Everything is done, the redistricting is done, and the year that it's required for somebody to live in that district has complied with and everything. So, like...like Senator Cudaback said, heck, what's the purpose of this bill? Do it next year and everything and quit out the...cut out the mass confusion that you're...that you're causing with this bill. The Attorney General's Opinion says, in essence, probably it isn't necessary either, as I read it. Like...like...everything is in place under 614, now you're going to have mass confusion. I'm going to be representing way down in the Omaha, from Lincoln to Omaha, a new district. Senator Schrock is going to be in Omaha, and like Senator Cudaback, he's representing 20,000 new people, but Senator Bud Robinson is going to throw his district because it changed drastically, and Senator Hefner, everybody in here is going to be affected by this. It should be passed next year, and then there will be not mass confusion, and I will not be representing Madison County. If there's some reason we have to come in after this, I will be representing that area, if we have a special session, and I don't know the people, very few, they don't know me, and so that's a representative they're going to have to rely on, on...on votes. Same way with Senator Schrock or anybody in here with their new area. Now they know everybody, you know everybody, the district, and it's changed. I...I just think that it's not needed, it's absolutely not needed. And why put it into statute now and we'll cause all this...this confusion, which it could. I ask for the adoption of the kill motion. Thank you.
