

SPEAKER BAACK: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...it has always been appointed by the Governor of the state, and maybe the thought was that this is some kind of an exception because the regulatory program is under the Secretary of State's office, but can you elaborate as to why we went the unusual path of having the Secretary of State appoint an advisory board which he then...which gives him, of course, greater control over things, and I guess my question is, would it be good to have the Governor appoint the advisory board, and then let the secretary go ahead and do his thing?

SENATOR BEYER: Well, I would have no problem with that. I think probably the reason we went this particular way is the fact that he right now is overseeing all the issuance of licenses as they are currently being applied for and handed out.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I want to make something crystal-clear because my approach has been somewhat negative towards this bill. I don't have anything against the Secretary of State. In fact, he and I get along very well, but because I get along well with him is not a reason for me to support an atrocious bill such as this. Senator Beyer made a comment which I cannot allow to stand without further elaboration. Senator Beyer, may I continue my discussion with you? SENATOR BEYER: (Mike off) He was involved originally in the drafting of the bill, and back in November 15th of 1985, he spoke and was draft...or helped to write the original bill that we have been working on and worked out to everything, and, let's see, but, basically, that is, I guess, what it was and he was opposed to it because he was not included in being one of the instructors I guess is the problem we had with...or that he had with it.
