

SENATOR BEYER: I don't think any of us do to be honest with you. I think we are all...Senator Beutler, let me ask you the same question. Do you think that that would be...where did he go? A question of Senator Beutler now.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEYER: Do you think that would be a proper move to make rather than to try to write it here on the floor as to...since Senator Chambers is interested in working with it, and since I will not be here, is to get somebody else to introduce it. But it seems that everybody is concerned that there needs to be some regulation, if that might not be a better way to go?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator, that has to be your decision. My feelings are this, that it needs a lot of work. If somebody is willing to put in the time on it, they could certainly do it. The...I suppose the reason I would encourage them to do it is because the existing set of statutes is so poor, in my opinion, that maybe it makes sense to get something in that is a little better, if not perfect.

SENATOR BEYER: Well, one question of Senator Chambers. Senator Chambers, you understand that this, if we do not enact this now with the emergency clause, it will be two years before the licenses would be up for renewal?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Beyer, that, in itself, is not enough to encourage me to put...

SENATOR BEYER: No, that's...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...a bad piece of legislation on the books.

SENATOR BEYER: That isn't the question I asked you. I just said if you understood that it would be two years before we would get something on.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, I will accept what you said, but I think it is irrelevant.

SENATOR BEYER: Okay. I think everybody will have to make their own decision as to which way they want to go on the bracket motion. With that, I would think that is about it for any of us.
