

of the commission formed by the Governor and the Director of the Department of Social Services. I might share with you that the members of that subcommittee represented law enforcement, as well as the court system, as well as advocates and providers of services for children who are abused or neglected. The purpose of this amendment is to clarify the roles and responsibilities of the guardian ad litem in order to make for the best kind of handling of the cases of child abuse and neglect and, with that, I would urge your support of this amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Rasmussen. We will now vote on the Rasmussen amendment to LB 1184. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, Madam President, excuse me, on adoption of Senator Rasmussen's amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment is adopted. Are there further amendments, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Nothing further pending at this time, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Okay. Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Madam President and members, if Senator Rasmussen would yield to a couple of questions, please.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Rasmussen.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR MOORE: Senator Rasmussen, there is no fiscal impact, at least to the state, on this bill, at least yet. A couple questions. One question, as far as the county attorneys who are responsible in establishing and convening these meetings every...four times a year now with the committee amendments.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: At a minimum.

SENATOR MOORE: I mean is there...if you...have you, yourself, had any conversation with any county, like particularly Douglas County, I mean are we talking some significant...any sort of significant impact on the county level at all, the local level at all?
