Senator Beutler. Senator, your amendment would move to strike Section 1.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Clerk, I'd withdraw that amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment is withdrawn. Objection?

CLERK: Madam President, I now have an amendment from Senators Hartnett, Schimek, Bohlke, Rod Johnson. I have a further request to divide the amendment into nine parts, Senator, is that what you want to do, nine parts?

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Madam Chairman, members of the body, I think there is a handout. You have got about three handouts. I think you have got a copy of the amendment. I think you have a short version, and then you have a longer version of the amendment, and this bill was Urban Affairs Committee bill, 369, and so there was some controversy. All of these amendments advanced out of committee without any dissenting votes, but some people in the body have raised questions, and rather than deal with them individually, I'd like simply to deal with each different bill separately, and on the longer version, the three or four page version, that I would simply start to...like to start dealing with each one of the particular sections. So with that, with the body, and I could explain each one of them as they are on the sheet here.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Hartnett. I will rule that they are divisible and we will take up the first section that you wish to do, so...

CLERK: Senator, so we are in sync, you are going to take up Section 1.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yeah, LB 104.

CLERK: Thank you.
