

causing notice to be provided as required by this section, is that still in the bill?

SENATOR PIRSCH: That is the compromise, yes.

SENATOR ABOUD: Okay, so that is still in there. Section 4 and Section 5 are. And then the mailing provision is in there as well, right?

SENATOR PIRSCH: Yes, the mailing provisions are in there.

SENATOR ABOUD: And then the notice must be a notice in the form of a sign, of appropriate sign, of appropriate size and configuration...

SENATOR PIRSCH: No, the sign is gone. Omaha has not done that. Lincoln has done that, but they have had problems with that.

SENATOR ABOUD: Then the information as to the 25 day notice in the form of a first class mail note...mailed to individuals...

SENATOR PIRSCH: That is ten days before the planning board hearing. And then there is at least 30 days before the city council, and there is notice again before the city council.

SENATOR ABOUD: Senator Pirsch, what are we changing out of current law?

SENATOR PIRSCH: Pardon.

SENATOR ABOUD: What are we changing out of the current law in regards...

SENATOR PIRSCH: We have no law right now.

SENATOR ABOUD: We have no law.

SENATOR PIRSCH: We have no law.

SENATOR ABOUD: No notice.

SENATOR PIRSCH: We have no ordinance, we have no law. This is what the city says they do out of courtesy.
