

SENATOR PIRSCH: And what I am suggesting that the city should do for our property owners.

SENATOR ABOUD: So this is mandating to the city that if there is any zoning changes within 300 feet of a home, that they shall be required to give notice to all residents within that area?

SENATOR PIRSCH: Correct, 300 feet around the perimeter of the property to be rezoned.

SENATOR ABOUD: And if they fail to do that, there is no penalty, right?

SENATOR PIRSCH: Yes, but I think they would have indignant property owners if they do not follow this law.

SENATOR ABOUD: Well, Madam President, members, we are kind of getting into an area with these amendments, and I appreciate Senator Hartnett bringing us nine separate bills in one bill. I realize that we have all had problems with the way the session has been going,...
