SENATOR PIRSCH: That was my original term, and I would feel very comfortable with that.

SENATOR ABOUD: I will waive off.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Does anyone else wish to speak to this amendment? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Hartnett?

SENATOR HARTNETT: Madam President, members, I can understand Senator Bernard-Stevens, but I think this has been done before. I tried to give an explanation, and I could have tried to shove everything down through without splitting them up, but I decided to split them up. So I'd ask for the advancement of this particular section of this bill, Section 1.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Hartnett. We will now vote on Section 1 of the Hartnett amendment. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: A call of the house, and maybe not a roll call vote, just a machine vote please.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Hartnett. We have a request for a call of the house. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.
