simply strike those two lines, which are, again, unnecessary because the language is already very clear. I'd ask for your support. I'll try to answer any questions you might have.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Lynch. Mr. Clerk, an amendment on the desk.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a priority motion. Senator Lindsay would move to bracket LB 369 until April 16, 1992.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Madam President. I would ask that...or I would yield my time to Senator Hartnett.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: (Mike off) ...did bring, you know, bills that we heard in Urban Affairs that were noncontroversial, and I guess I apologize to the body, but I thought that they would...would kind of like consent calendar because they all came out of committee without any dissenting votes. With that, I simply would ask the bracket of this bill until the 16th of April. I want unanimous consent.

PRESIDENT MOUL: I have a request for unanimous consent. Without objection, that will be so ordered. LB 369 is bracketed until April 16th. We'll now return to LB 1061. Mr. Clerk, before we do, I would like to call the senators' attention to the south balcony. Special guests today of Senator Warner are 34 fourth graders from Lincoln Christian Elementary in Lincoln, Nebraska and their teachers. Would you please rise and be recognized. Welcome to the Chamber. Thank you.

CLERK: Madam President, 1061, Senator Will, I have...excuse me, Senator, I have Enrollment and Review amendments pending.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Madam President, I move the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 1061.

PRESIDENT MOUL: You've heard the motion to adopt the E & R amendments. All those in favor please say aye. Opposed nay. E & R amendments are adopted.
