

to be able to stay in it either. So, I would say that I am opposing this amendment as all it is doing is again trying to somewhat dismantle an industry again. And the cities now have been a great recipient of keno money and probably would expect to be. The little town of Doniphan, of which I'm very familiar, and the operator of the keno, they do get a lot of support from Fonner Park and from the horse racing industry, and simply just the fact that it's another industry in the county. So, I vigorously oppose the Abboud amendment and I think that the horsemen deserve to keep the industry still viable.

CLERK: 17 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is under call. Would all unexcused senators please return to the Chamber and record their presence. All unauthorized personnel must leave the floor, the house is under call. Would the senators please check in. While the senators are proceeding to the Chamber, I will recognize Senator Abboud for closing.
