So I would encourage that. You've heard the motion to adjourn until tomorrow morning at 9:00 a.m. All those in favor say aye. Machine vote has been requested. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on the motion to adjourn. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 18 nays on the motion to adjourn,
Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: The motion fails. Proceed with the next amendment.

CLERK: Senator Chambers would move to amend, Mr. President.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker, in the spirit of collegiality, I will withdraw that amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: The next motion I have is by you, Senator Will.

CLERK: Senator Will would move to suspend Rule 6, Section 5; Rule 7, Section 3, and vote on the advancement of LB 1061 without further amendment and/or debate.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the body, I, obviously, do not have 30 votes to suspend the rules at this time with 33 people on the floor. If the body wants to force a vote on LB 1061 tonight, that may well be possible. I think it's also very doubtful whether I would have the votes to advance the bill at this point. But there's no point in wasting the body's time taking up a suspension motion. I would withdraw the motion at this time.

SPEAKER BAACK: It is withdrawn.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Abboud would move to amend the bill.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Abboud.

SENATOR ABOUD: Mr. President, colleagues, in the spirit of moving these bills along, I am going to be withdrawing that particular amendment.
