

resolution that I introduced going to the Government Committee, which is a little bit more narrow, that would look specifically at the question of when does one man, one vote apply, who does it apply to and that which it applies to, are they now in compliance and, if not, what should we do. Those are the areas that we'll be looking at specifically. Obviously, anything that's done on a board representation now or in the future would have to be analyzed through that study and we would have to respond to that based upon the information we have.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Okay. One last question. Over the years, there's been discussion of dropping Adams County out of the Central's Board since they're not served by the irrigation that's provided through Central. Your plan is not to, or you do not have any personal opinions of taking the Adams County representation off the board.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Well,...

SENATOR WARNER: One minute.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: ..Senator, I have a...if I can take the last 40 seconds though, I have a personal opinion. I had a bill introduced, as you're aware of, a few years ago that would have taken Adams County off and replaced it with three. That was my personal preference at the time. It may even be that now but, quite honestly, my personal preference doesn't play in here. It's I'm allowing the district to be able to do that which it wants to do and my clear understanding is one thing they do not want to do is to remove any of the representation from Adams County, so that is not a variable that's at play at this point.

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. Chairman and members of the body, I have a couple of questions for Senator Bernard-Stevens. I was going to also ask the question about Adams County because, in the Natural Resource Committee, we heard that they really don't have any representation and I think also Rod Johnson brought up a...Senator Rod Johnson brought up a question about one vote, so forth. Are we going to...do we know what the Power Review Board, and when are they going to make a decision on this, so if we don't, in the Legislature, don't agree with what the Central Board do, could we have a chance to look at....?
