

SENATOR LAMB: Raise the call.

SENATOR MOORE: ...are...are, at least as requested make sense. I have no problem with the A bill. The only one thing I would mention is the opportunity to mention this, because we never really had the opportunity to address the A bill. But one of my concerns with LB 1063 and 1063A is the fact that there is little or no money appropriated by anyone to enforce this whole new method of taxation. Obviously, we're spending \$90,000 at the state level to print some forms and print some guidelines. But on the local level, at the same time we're implementing a new tax, there's also a lid there. And so your local county assessors are going to have to, whatever new things they do with this tax structure is going to have to be done within their own budget. I think one of the concerns that I have is that as we change all this, without giving either some assistance from the state, or giving some ability for those local government officials to deal with that properly, we're going to have some enforcement problems because it does not adequately...there's not enough funds appropriated to adequately enforce this new tax system on the local level in the State of Nebraska. Obviously, that's a local problem not a state problem. But in concert with the lid, there is little those local governments are going to be able to do to enforce this new method. And I think we're going to have a tremendous compliance problem. I think county assessors' hands are going to be tied, to (inaudible) do much about it. Such is the concern dealing on the A bill side of the bill. But it's far from the state's point of view. The A bill is correct. The last thing I would say, and if Senator Warner wants to use my time or say it's not proper to discuss it at this time, that's fine, too. But, Senator Warner, I read in the paper early this week where the lids contained in LB 1063 were responsible for a \$3.6 million shortfall in the City of Lincoln's budget. I guess I'm just...how can a lid create a shortfall? And I guess I wasn't understanding that. And if Senator Warner wants to use my time, or if he says this is not the time to discuss...he can have the balance of my time.
