

and Senator Wesely and myself, this time, we just made sure it was just senators on it. So we'll see what happens because of that. But with that I'd simply ask for the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Moore. We'll now vote on the Moore amendment to LB 1022. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted on the Moore amendment? Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of Senator Moore's amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Lynch would move to amend. (Amendment appears on page 1814 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Lynch.

SENATOR LYNCH: Madam President and members, this amendment has to deal with...deals with teacher salaries, and I thought it would be important to discuss this one more time. I didn't realize, until yesterday, and one of the reasons I'm doing this, this morning again is that those coveted Highway Trust Funds that we discussed at some great length, not too long ago, are being used to subsidize some large companies. Can you believe that. And there is also some of it being used to build buildings. And it's really interesting to me that those people that were very concerned about the sales tax that went into the trust fund that was intended for education was, in fact, they made it appear to be a really scandalous, scandalous effort. But I've had a few letters, not many, from my constituents who are concerned about this. And I intend to provide as much information I can to them about how trust funds are actually being used. And apparently they didn't know it either that these trust funds are going to build buildings in the subsidized companies. So I'm not going to try to address the issue of using trust funds, of course, to reestablish salaries for teachers, but I would like to refer to the original 1022 on page 21, bottom of the page, line 24, Section 1, in the original Governor's proposal he wanted to replace that \$8 million, an increase from 7 to 15 million dollars from General Fund sources those revenues for teachers salaries. I think it was also his recommendation that it come out of 1059 funds, and obviously
