LB 145, 1268, 1292

LB 1268 to E & R for engrossment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: You've heard the motion to advance LB 1268. All those in favor please say aye. Opposed nay. LB 1268 is advanced. LB 1292.

CLERK: LB 1292, Senator, has E & R amendments.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Madam President, I move the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 1292.

PRESIDENT MOUL: You've heard the motion to adopt the E & R amendments. All those in favor please say aye. Opposed nay. The E & R amendments are adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further pending, Senator.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Madam President, I move the advancement of LB 1292 to E & R for engrossment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: You've heard the motion to advance LB 1292. All those in favor please say aye. Opposed nay. LB 1292 is advanced. We will proceed then with General File, LB 145.

CLERK: Madam President, 145 was a bill introduced by Senators Wesely, Chambers, Schimek, Schellpeper, Morrissey, Bernard-Stevens. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 10 of last year, referred to Business and Labor Committee. On March 26th of this year, committee amendments were adopted. There was a motion to indefinitely postpone the bill by Senator Bernard-Stevens. Senator Wesely chose to lay the bill over. That motion is now pending.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Bernard-Stevens. Pull the motion. Senator Wesely, would you bring us up to date on the bill?

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you, Madam President, and members, we did spend some time on this the other day, Thursday, I guess it was. The Family Medical Leave Act, as it's currently constituted, as amended by committee, provides for unpaid six weeks of leave over a two-year period. That does also provide for benefits
