SENATOR HALL: And I would agree with that.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Time. Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: On the bill?

PRESIDENT MOUL: On the committee amendments. Okay, thank you, Senator Lamb. Does anyone else wish to speak to the committee amendments? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Just very briefly, Madam President. Even if you are an opponent of the proposal, the committee amendments do build in the progressivity with the \$17,000 split in terms of the fee schedule as it relates. It also includes the LB 1223 that Senator Lynch introduced that is the different taxing method for the rental car fleets, and the technical changes that have already been adopted to the committee amendments. I would urge the adoption of the committee amendments to clean up LB 1135 and have it in front of us in a proper fashion.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Hall. We will now vote on the committee amendments to LB 1135. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted?

SENATOR HALL: Madam President, we are going to need a call of the house. I would ask for one now, please.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: And call in votes.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We've got a request for a call of the house. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.
