

416 which obviously would in effect kill the bill. In support of my motion I would echo Senator Chambers from earlier this afternoon when he said, I hate this bill. That would be the extent of my...if, Senator Chambers, if you'd like any of the opening I'd be happy to give it to you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Lindsay. Madam President and members of the Legislature, I will be very brief because I think everything that can be said about this bill has been said that is in any way good. In fact, all that had been said when the Clerk read the number of the bill. The bad things allow us to say much more, but I'm not going to do that. Rather than spend a lot of additional time on this bill which is not a good bill, I don't believe it's going to go anyplace anyway. This vote will allow us to lay the bill aside without actually killing it. So Senator Conway's opponent will still have a live issue when he runs against him because that bill will be hanging out there alive, worst bill Senator Conway ever brought. He's going to have to plead temporary insanity. Well, there's something that I don't want to say because I don't see Senator Conway here, but I think we ought to go ahead and bracket this bill and then move forward.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Does anyone wish to speak to the bracket motion? Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well I will, Madam President and members, for whoever is here. I guess I support the bracket. I didn't hear the rationale for Senator Lindsay, but I just want to encourage Senator Byars to go to plan B. I appreciate your working hard on that issue, but I can't view this bill very gladly and I then, it does bother me that your amendment would be on it and so from that viewpoint I support the bracket motion rather than I guess say if we're going to do that ahead of going ahead and supporting the advancement of the bill.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Byars. Senator Elmer.

SENATOR ELMER: Thank you, Madam President. I've been listening to the debate tonight with considerable interest, demonstrates to me how screwed up our personal property tax system is in this state. Personal property is something that you use for this or for that. We just passed 1063 which is going to tax some personal property that is income producing on some sort of a
