

up 100,000 into the enterprise zone and that's simply what it does. We reinstate that language. There are three types of enterprise zones that we're talking about. The regular enterprise zone, the federal enterprise zone which has been passed by Congress in 1987. It has never been funded and you have to have, if the federal enterprise zone is going to be funded, it has to be funded at a different level than any other tax agreements we have with businesses so it has to be something above what 270 is if we're going to qualify and I think some day Congress is going to pass something like that. The other part of the types of enterprise zone, we call them special enterprise zones as we pass out the paper, says that a single employer from a city within 12 months period loses jobs and they can qualify as an enterprise zone. The rationale is that that would be not for primary class cities or not for metropolitan cities, would be for first class cities or counties and that's simply what the amendment to the amendment does. We simply need more funds into the, higher than the LB 270 and I visited with Senator Hall off the mike and so forth, it has to be something higher and the reason for it is if you put, if you go into an area where it is depressed, they need more funds. The value is not as much. I think the figure is if you, on a tax thing you can probably get 75 percent if you locate some place in Omaha or some place in Lincoln, but with the other, in a place that's not a part of this enterprise zone with a high unemployment and other qualifications make up the enterprise zone, then you need more. That's about 65 percent. So you need the extra money to qualify for this enterprise zone. So with that I would try to answer any questions or simply as it relates to this amendment to the amendment.
