SENATOR BOHLKE: Okay, right.

SENATOR LABEDZ: And I will do that on my own time.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Okay, well, thank you. Then what you're saying is you don't agree, so you don't thing members of the Legislature should deal with it? I don't mean to be...I'm just trying to clear up...

SENATOR LABEDZ: We're trying...

SENATOR BOHLKE: The sentence says the members of the Legislature. And my question is, should members of the Legislature deal with it or not, yes or no?

SENATOR LABEDZ: I will not answer that with a yes or no. I will answer it on my own time and give an explanation.
