SENATOR MORRISSEY: Time.

SENATOR LANDIS: There is a third element of that opening I'd like to talk about and I'll do that when I renew my light. Thank you.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Thank you, Senator Landis. Our next speaker is Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, when I had talked the first time I had mentioned where Senator Lindsay had indicated that he wants these women to make their decision without being pressured. I wonder what he thinks about those howling, yowling mobs who assault these women when they come to obtain an abortion. I want to ask Senator Lindsay a question. Senator Lindsay, I want to deal specifically with the 24-hour waiting period. Every woman would be required to wait for 24 hours before the abortion is performed after having given informed consent. Is that correct?

SENATOR LINDSAY: That is my understanding, yes, except in an emergency situation.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right. Now your feeling then is that no woman possesses the intellectual, moral and emotional ability to make that decision without waiting 24 hours? That's your position, right?

SENATOR LINDSAY: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then why do you require every woman to be in that position?

SENATOR LINDSAY: Because, Senator Chambers, as I mentioned, the decision otherwise is done under a high pressure tactic in a clinic that has a pecuniary interest in seeing that the procedure take place.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And you feel that you and those who support this bill know what is best for every woman in every situation, therefore, you make this blanket declaration that they all must wait 24 hours.
