

SENATOR LABEDZ: Senator, that's what I've been doing for 16 years, trying to get the Legislature to work together on the abortion issue and informed consent, as far as I am concerned, is one that we should be working together on rather than doing what you're doing and Senator Hillman and Senator Rasmussen in opposing, and I don't want to take more of your time. I've got my light on and I will go into that further because I didn't have enough time to finish what I had to say.

SENATOR BOHLKE: No, you really...what I was asking was the question, the sentence that I read, and you said that that's what you've been doing for 16 years, right?

SENATOR LABEDZ: Right, trying to get the Legislature to agree on the abortion issue. Almost every amendment that I introduced and this one...

SENATOR BOHLKE: Excuse me, Senator Labeledz, you said you're trying to get the Legislature to agree on the abortion issue. What I'm trying to get to is what this is, is to work, diligently work together to find the best possible solution for all citizens. I suggest the abortion issue comes after the fact. That comes after the fact of the unwanted pregnancy.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Well, perhaps you should ask Senator Rasmussen and Senator Hillman what happened to the task force on LR 130 because I did try to at least recommend four or five people that would work with the task force on the issue and I haven't heard or haven't got any information as to what happened to the task force and I'd like to hear from either one of them to see what's going on and what the committee is doing or the task force and with the people that I recommended so far to deal with teenage pregnancy.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Excuse me.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Right.
