I have been in this Legislature, this is my second session, and if you haven't noticed, I haven't risen a whole lot to talk too many times unless it was something that I felt quite deeply about or something that I felt I might have something to offer. In many cases, I feel that I have worked with senators behind the scenes and, I don't know, is Senator Lindsay here? Senator Lindsay was extremely helpful in working with my office this year in proposing legislation. And what I would hope that we have come to the point in time where we have recognized a need that where we could work together again. I like words like "choice" and I like words like "reasonable", although sometimes in tax issues we looked at the word "reasonable" and questioned its interpretation. But I think words like "reasonable" and "win win" can happen here in this body. And when we look at the items that we agree on, not the ones that we disagree on, I think that's the only way we make progress. So for us to say that I think what...
