If you then look at the other end of the scale, all the way down to the bottom, to the most underworked districts in the state, you'll see that the points go all the way down to 375, 414, 427, in other words not even half, not even half the workload of the most heavily worked districts. This system is so eschew that there are a whole number of solutions to the problems that create a better system than what we now have. There are a whole number of variations that are preferable. Okay, having shown you, or having acquainted you with the 10 year average, you may also want to direct your attention, at some point, to the judicial statistics for just one year, 1990, and the reason that I wanted to direct your attention to it is because it shows you a little bit...

And if you take a look at that, you will see that the districts are individually shown, the cases, the raw number of cases filed in each district is...is calculated in each instance. And then you'll see it takes into account the number of counties, it takes into account the number of counties, the number of stops the judge has to make. And it also takes into account and gives special weight to mileage and to nights away from home. It also gives special consideration to jury cases that take longer. But the reason I'm belaboring this point is because you're going to hear something about distances in...in larger counties. But what I want to make clear to you right now at the very beginning is that distances are already taken into effect in these workload statistics.
