LB 366, 1059, 1237, 1240A

SPEAKER BAACK: Time.

SENATOR CHIZEK: ...there is some correlation. I'll close and ask for your support of 1059.

SPEAKER BAACK: We are looking for Chambers, Rogers, Schmit and Hillman. The house is under call. We are looking for Senator Schmit and Chambers. Senator Schmit, would you check in, please. All members are now present. We are voting on the advancement of LB 1059. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? A record vote has been requested. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See page 1965 of the Legislative Journal.) 27 ayes, 19 nays on the advancement of LB 1059, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 1059 advances. Items for the record, Mr. Clerk. I'll raise the call.

CLERK: Mr. President, your Committee on Enrollment and Review reports LB 366 as correctly engrossed. Amendments to be printed to LB 1240A by Senator Landis. (See page 1979 of the Legislative Journal.) That's all that I had, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Okay, we will now proceed on the agenda to LB 1237.

CLERK: Mr. President, 1237 was a bill introduced by Senators Wickersham, Baack, Nelson and Hillman. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 22, referred to Judiciary Committee, advanced to General File.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Wickersham, would you like to open on the bill?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. In view of the last vote, some of you may think that 1237 has no purpose or validity because you've made an initial decision that you're going to change the number of judicial districts for the district courts in the State of Nebraska and at some point in time you're going to try to reduce the number of judges in the system.
