

operators' license and our state identification cards, which currently are \$10. They would be raised to \$16. Now this is not \$10 every year. This is \$10 for a 4-year operators' license. The increase would be to \$16 over the period of a 4-year license. You can divide that out and it is a fairly small increase for the operators' license. That still does not cover the entire cost to the department for having that operators' license issued and maintained. We are also increasing, this is now a county fee, the issuance of an original certificate of title goes from \$6 to 10. The replacement or duplicate certificates of title will go from \$10 to \$14. The refiling of a certificate of title will go from \$4 to \$8, and, finally, noting a lien on a certificate of title will go from \$3 to \$7. In addition to those fees, the committee amendment has also embodied the concept of 1092, where the county treasurer will collect an additional dollar and a half for each registration of certificate issued on these titles. A dollar of that will go to the county and the other 50 cents will go to the Nebraska State Patrol Computer Cash Fund to assist in putting the records on to their computer records, and that, I assume Senator Schellpeper will explain that. Senator Robak brought to us LB 1095. I am sure that she will be explaining some of the merits of that bill, and that it was a request that we needed to bring these fees up, that the Department of Motor Vehicles was seriously underfunded, facing some financial shortfalls, that they were going to be faced with limiting the number of people doing drivers' license examining out in certain areas, that they were going to be having to search for another way to have a camera system and an imaging system for the operators' licenses. In Nebraska, we are somewhat spoiled. You can go to the court house and receive your operators' license in the same day. That is not true in many states. In many states, you will send in your request for an operators' license, and it could take at least a couple of weeks for someone to centrally issue you back an operators' license. In comparison to other areas, our operators' license is relatively inexpensive. The history of the operators' license did change. In 1981, we went from 7 to 10 dollars. In 1977, we went from 6 to 7 dollars. So you can see our increases in our operators' license has not been dramatic or drastic.
