SENATOR HALL: Speeding tickets, whatever it might be?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Yeah, whatever it might be. Then what happens is that they must send notice to those people of the revocation, itself. They also must notify the law enforcement agencies. If they have a pickup order, they have to do that. The reinstatement comes in sending notice to those people that they are eligible for reinstatement and they have to show to them that they have either complied with, for example if they have an accident and didn't have insurance, that they have the necessary insurance or they have to post a bond, or that they have taken care of the accident...

SENATOR HALL: But all those requirements are on the part of the licensee?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: No, those are...those are, well, the licensee has to comply with that, but the department has to notify them, and the department...

SENATOR HALL: They send them a letter.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Well, they send...that is right, they send them a certified, a registered letter, and then they have to verify that those things were done.

SENATOR HALL: So the licensee has to bring in verification?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Right.

SENATOR HALL: They have the burden to prove that?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Well, they have a burden but it is the Department of Motor Vehicles that keeps track of those and verifies...

SENATOR HALL: They check off that it has been taken care of.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Well, or they check to make sure that that person, when they say I do have high-risk insurance, they go back and check through to make sure that they do...

SENATOR HALL: They make a phone call to their insurance
