LB 872, 922, 1178, 1178A

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 1178 passes. LB 1178A.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 1178A on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 1178A pass? All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: The vote is 40 ayes, 0 nays, 9 excused and not voting. (See page 2002 of Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 1178A passes. LB 872.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 872 in Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 872 pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: The vote is 38 ayes, 0 nays, 4 present and not voting, 7 excused and not voting, Madam President. (See page 2003 of Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 872 passes with the emergency clause attached. Mr. Clerk, a motion on the desk.

CLERK: Madam President, priority motion, Senator Dierks would move to reconsider the Final Reading vote on LB 922.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Dierks.

SENATOR DIERKS: Madam President and members of the body, I felt like that as early as we got together this morning and with the lack of enough people here to...that would support this legislation I felt we should give it another chance and, you know, I understand how some people feel about this. I think that there's another thought we ought to remember. We need to do I believe in this arena everything we can to foster understanding, and I think this type of legislation is a step toward doing that, and I think I would just encourage those of you who couldn't support it to take another look and see if you can't find in your hearts to do something in the way of
