SPEAKER BAACK: We have a division request. Senator Wesely, would you respond to the division request?

SENATOR WESELY: Yes, that would be Section 39 of the amendment should be separated out. The rest could stay in. Section 39 would be the one that Senator Hall would wish to address independently.

SPEAKER BAACK: Is that the way you would like to divide it, Senator Hall?

SENATOR HALL: Yes, that's fine. That's the issue about allowing nonhealth care professionals to draw blood, yes. I'd like that separated out.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you.

CLERK: Senator Wesely, just so we're in sync, Senator, when you say Section 39 it's the new language towards the back...the end of the amendment. Talks about persons obtaining blood specimens, is that it? That's the new language and...

SENATOR WESELY: Right.

CLERK: Right, okay, and just that one section.

SENATOR HALL: That one section is the only one that...

CLERK: Okay, thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Okay. My understanding is that it is clearly divisible on those lines. And so, Senator Wesely, which picce of the...would you like to take up first?

SENATOR WESELY: Could we go to the first three first and do Senator Hall's second.
