Have you all voted on the motion to cease debate? Have you all voted? Senator Lynch.

SENATOR LYNCH: (Microphone not activated) ...before, but I will ask for a call of the house and accept call-in votes.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Lynch. We have a request for a call of the house. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is under call. Would all unexcused senators please return to the Chamber and record your presence. All unauthorized personnel must leave the floor. Would the senators please record their presence. We are accepting call-in votes on the motion to cease debate.

CLERK: Senator Lamb voting yes. Senator Wesely voting yes. Senator Will voting yes. Senator Coordsen voting yes. Senator Robinson voting yes. Senator Nelson voting yes. Senator Moore voting yes. Senator Ashford voting yes. Senator Abboud voting yes. Senator Lowell Johnson voting yes.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 5 nays to cease debate.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Debate has ceased and I will recognize Senator Hall for closing.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Madam President, and members, the issue of reduction in the fee is one simply of equity, I believe. Senator Kristensen argues that the fees are needed for purposes of the cameras. Senator Schellpeper argues that the fees should cover the cost. Senator Kristensen argues that these individuals are a drain on the system so we should basically penalize them to a greater extent, put the burden for these new cameras on them. Senator Schellpeper argues that the fee, at its present level, doesn't cover the cost. But there's been no justification to that point. No one, to date, has handed out information other than the information that dealt with the issue of raising the fees and how much it would cost. It is more, and I agree with Senator Hillman, than just a simple revocation or...excuse me, a duplication of a license, but it is

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
