

not \$100 worth of paper work. It is not \$100 worth of administrative cost. It's an issue of raising additional money and that's all it is. And we're targeting roughly about, how many, 6,000 people, if that many, that get their license revoked, if you've got 6,500 people to raise \$650,000 at \$100 a pop, we're going to target those 6,500 people and ask them to bear a greater share of the burden for purposes of this cost. It is unfair and it will have a detrimental effect in terms of the issue of those people going in and looking for a reissuance of the license. They will not do it. Senator Landis is absolutely right. I mentioned that the other day but not as well as he did. It's exactly what's going to happen. They're just going to back off and say, I don't need it. I've been driving without it anyway, why should I do it at this point? There is no justification for 100 percent full duplication, doubling of that fee. There is.. there hasn't been any to date and the ones that have been made have been all across the board. They're not even in tune with each other in terms of the justification of the issue. Senator Hillman gets up and protects the appropriation process which I understand because it's more money to work with in the General Fund. But that's all this is. We want to raise money, these are the smallest group of people we can nick and we're going to do it by raising that fee for reissuing the license a hundredfold. I would urge that you adopt the amendment to the committee amendments. Six hundred and fifty thousand dollars out of an \$8 million pot, I don't think will jeopardize any contract for a few cameras that the counties need to take pictures of licenses. With that, Madam President, I would yield the balance of my time to Senator Chambers.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, how much time remains?

PRESIDENT MOUL: A little less than two minutes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. I support Senator Hall's amendment for all of the reasons he gave. And I've listened to the debate on the bill thus far and the county officials and those representing them on this floor are about as unreasonable as people have been on other bills when they think they've got everything their way. But you should remember that there are those of us who feel we represent people and not county boards and county governments and this bill is so bad and it is so
