SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Schellpeper. Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the body. I guess I am a little uncertain as to what Senator Kristensen's amendment does, and if he would go into a little dialogue, maybe at least to help me, and maybe some other members of the body. The committee amendments as we have before us now, with the exception of the Robak amendment to the amendment, which was agreed to yesterday, with the exception of the Hall amendment, which was agreed to, which technically modified 1092, 1095, LB 1095 of the bill, with those exceptions, the committee amendment, basically, had Senator Schellpeper's 1092 and Senator Robak's LB 1095, and I guess my question at this point is twofold. First part of the question would be, in LB 1095, Senator Robak's bill, which was included in the committee amendments, what would be left...what would be stricken and what would be left of that portion?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Senator Bernard-Stevens, if this amendment would be adopted that is before us right now, the reinstatement fee for revocations on operator's license fee increase would not occur. It would remain the same. The original issuance of a message plate would remain the same. There would be no decrease there, nor would there be a decrease in the annual renewal of the message plate license plate. So those three items would be taken out. What would remain would be the certified copies from the Department of Motor Vehicles and the operator's license increase.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Okay, the operator license increase was the \$6 increase, which, technically, I guess I would argue is the 4.5 million dollar tax increase, I mean that portion is still there, the 4.5 million.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: I would...according to the way you phrased it, yes, that is (interruption).

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: The fee change would create 4.5 million dollars.
