LB 1092, 1095

SPEAKER BAACK: Debate has ceased. I will go to Senator Kristensen to close on your amendment.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Members of the Legislature, just to recap what this amendment does because I know people have been coming and going, this deals, there are two sections of LB 1092. One of them was the original LB 1095 introduced by Senator Robak, the other is 1092 introduced by Senator Schellpeper. The amendment that I have proposed takes out one of the controversial matters that was up for discussion, which is actually a fee decrease, but because of the decrease, increases the amount of revenue that is generated. In an effort to try to take those controversial pieces out so that the bill may move, hopefully, a number of us, well, at least two or three of us, have decided to pull their amendments and wait until Select File, and would allow this bill to be voted on. I do believe the question will be divided, so you can have the opportunity to vote on certain packages of fees. This takes out the fee reduction for the issuance of a message plate, so it will remain at \$75. It also takes out the decrease in the annual renewal, and so that it would remain at \$35 instead of both of them being 27. And I would ask for the adoption of this amendment to the committee amendments, and then we will discuss further, if there is a division of the question. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: You have heard the closing on the amendment offered by Senator Kristensen. We will now vote on the amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 22 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Kristensen's amendment to the committee amendments.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment to the committee amendments is adopted. Next item, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator Chambers, you have the next amendment to the committee amendments.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker, I would like to be sure from the Clerk that it is the one that I think it is. Is that the one that says strike Section 6?

CLERK: Yes, sir.
