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question is, yes, I think it is essential that you use that technology.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Suppose something comes along which makes it possible to modify this imaging that you were talking about? Then it becomes necessary to put a bigger fee on the citizens in order to create a system that those few, who might abuse the system, will not be able to beat, is that correct, or is that not?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Well, I think that is probably accurate that if you have some addition to technology, but that becomes a policy choice, do we want to spend the money to do that, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right, and I think whenever we are going to increase taxes, policy must come into play because we are taking something from the citizens. Here is what I am really getting at now. Do you think the majority of citizens alter their driver's license or that identification picture card in a way that is fraudulent or for the purpose of defrauding or misusing the driver's license or the identification card?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: I don't think a majority do.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What percentage, if you would give a ball park figure, would you say?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Senator Chambers, I don't have that even in my bank of knowledge. People in General Affairs probably do because they have heard that testimony before. I think Senator Hillman might even have an interest in that area, but in terms of numbers, I don't know.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, I will ask her. Senator Hillman, what percentage is estimated of the population that would misuse a driver's license or the identification card?

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Hillman.

SENATOR HILLMAN: I do not have a percentage either, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Then let me put Senator Kristensen's feet back near the fire, if I may.
