LB 1092A, 1092

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Once again I think we have been on this bill long enough. It has been discussed. I do want to apologize to the body for taking so long. I know there is a lot of bills following it. I didn't realize it was going to be that controversial. I knew some people didn't like part of it, but I thought we could probably work our way it. I know there is going to be some amendments that Senator Chambers does not like that he wants to discuss on Select File. I'm willing to work it out with him and the Appropriations Committee. We need to try to find some funds some place so that the Department of Motor Vehicles can operate because they are going to be short some funds now since we took some out, but I think we can try to work it out the next couple of days. We don't have very much time, but I think we've already spent enough time on this bill so I would just move the bill. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Schellpeper. Anyone else wishing to speak to the advancement of LB 1092? Seeing no one, Senator Schellpeper, do you wish to close? He waives closing. We will now vote on the advancement of LB 1092. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 1092.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 1092 advances. We will now proceed to LB 1092A.

CLERK: Mr. President, 1092A was a bill introduced by Senator Schellpeper. (Read title.) I have amendments. Senator Ashford, I understand you want to hold yours, Senator. Pass over at this time. Senator Moore. Senator Moore would move to amend, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Mr. Speaker and members, as Senator Kristensen had outline earlier, this actual amendment that I introduced was a recommendation of the Appropriations Committee. Basically since the bill has been somewhat riddled with changes, I guess at this point in time I'm uncomfortable in going through with this amendment because there's not enough money to fund it
