

create a system that I think is abhorrent and unfair because of the damage that it does to the legal system, to the principles of justice. Is this principle applying to everybody so situated in a way that is equal? This bill does not and my amendment is designed to deal with that.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Discussion on the Chambers amendment. Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members. Senator Chambers, I want to point your attention to a handout that I put on your desk but also to two amendments that have been printed in the Journal and they are AM3901 and AM3915. They were printed separately in the Journal and I don't have the page numbers right at my fingertips, but what the first amendment does and when they come up, and I believe they are up right after your amendment or we'll get right to them, is that it does take out the zero tolerance for minors that you were just discussing and it takes out the presumption which I think are the two problems that you had earlier on and some of the other people had done. I propose to take those amendments out of the bill and then I have some other things, the summary sheets as to what I'll do and at the appropriate time and then I was going to discuss on how they would play together, but for...you may have the rest of my time to ask questions back and forth.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, Senator Kristensen, on page 22 is my amendment, would one of the amendments that you have take all of Section 7 out? Is that what you had said so that I'm clear. That would be lines...
