

pass. Senator Baack's amendment said that if you're going to count prior offenses you only go down to six years. I'd like to see that at ten. I had an amendment up there to do it to ten. With Senator Baack's cooperation and Senator Beyer, 3901 comes in at eight years. So it goes halfway in between the six that Senator Baack had and the ten that is current law that I'd like to stay at and we're at eight. There are people that probably would like that to go up even higher. I'm sure there are people that would like to have it go down lower, but 3901 does set that at eight years. Here's what I envision, that we would be allowed to take a vote. I don't think that 3901 should be that controversial. There are a lot of other good points that are in here, the two most controversial things, three most controversial things are taken out and we adopt this amendment. The second amendment which I will offer next is AM3915. This is the amendment that would instate ALR, administrative license revocation. This is the real purpose of Senator Beyer had for his bill, and this will allow an up or down vote for the body to vote on whether they want ALR or not. If it passes, great. I think that that is good policy. If it fails, we still have the items that are included in 3901 which I think at a minimum need to be done in the state, just if nothing else, to bring us up to date and correct some of the problems that we had. I don't know that anyone has agreed to 3915. I do believe that is good state policy, but Senator Baack, I and Senator Beyer did come to a meeting of the minds and think that 3901 which we will vote on right now is an appropriate amendment that covers the basis we need to cover at this point in time. If ALR doesn't get adopted, you still have a good piece of legislation dealing with the problem of drunk driving. With that I would, if the body has some questions about procedure or what one amendment has or does not have, I'd be glad to answer that. With that I would urge the adoption of AM3901. Thank you.
