SENATOR ROGERS: Mr. Speaker...

SENATOR WARNER: A call of the house is requested.

SENATOR ROGERS: Okay.

SENATOR WARNER: A call of the house has been requested. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Clerk, record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 15 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SENATOR WARNER: And now the house is under call. Members return to the Chamber and record your presence. The motion pending is to cease debate. Call-in votes to be accepted. The motion is to cease debate.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Senator Hartnett voting yes. Senator Ashford voting yes. Senator Rod Johnson voting yes. Senator Nelson voting yes. Senator Schrock voting yes. Senator Wickersham voting yes. Senator Peterson voting yes. Senator Conway voting yes. Senator Cudaback voting yes.

SENATOR WARNER: Clerk, record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SENATOR HALL: Senator Warner, members, again I rise to ask you to vote for adoption of the amendment. Changes the mandatory minimum from 30 to 7 days and it also changes the six-year provision to seven as it currently exists in the bill and the eight-year provision in the amendment to seven. In 1991 there were 823 persons placed on probation for second offense DWI in Douglas County. They were given 48 hours in jail. If this is increased to five days because there is no mandatory minimum, just 48 hours is the standard in Douglas County on second offense. If those 823 people were put in the Douglas County
