

Kristensen said when he opened, he said that if ALR is not adopted, we still have a good bill, we still have a good bill. Now there are provisions in that that I disagree with, but I'm certainly not going to do anything to stop...to really fight that. It...it may very well be a good bill. And it will have an impact on DWI, Senator Crosby, it will be taking a step forward on that. But ALR is something different. This is the federal government telling us we have to do this because they want to do it for political reasons. It looks good in their circulars to say, hey, we're combating DWI, when, in effect, they're not doing that. They're trampling on our rights to make sure that they get themselves reelected. And that's not...all we can do is say, oh we're going to go along with it. But let's look at the federal funds that we're actually losing. Let's look at the revised fiscal note. The way I read it, and maybe I don't read these right, but we've taken out that big loss of \$600,000 from the fiscal note from December 30 of '91, and look at the fiscal note from 2-11-92, we've taken that out from federal funds...

SPEAKER BAACK: One minute.

SENATOR LINDSAY: ...and it says, see below. We look below and it says, DMV may be eligible for federal highway safety funds if this bill is passed. We may be eligible. This doesn't say we lose all this money if we don't adopt this. It doesn't say we're not going to get enough money to build all these roads if we adopt this. It says, well, if we adopt this we are eligible to put in our papers with everybody else, and maybe we'll get a couple of bucks back. We don't know what we'll lose if we don't adopt it. This is a serious, serious infringement upon people's rights. It's a serious change in the way we've been doing business. I don't think it's something that we ought to be doing lightly. I'd ask people to look at ALR very closely before we commit to it.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Chambers, you're next.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, I would like to ask Senator Kristensen a question.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Kristensen, would you respond, please.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I see him heading toward his mike, so I assume his answer will be yes. He said yes. Senator
