**SPEAKER BAACK PRESIDING**

**SPEAKER BAACK:** Good morning and welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chamber. For the prayer this morning we have Harland Johnson. Harland.

**HARLAND JOHNSON:** (Prayer offered.)

**SPEAKER BAACK:** Thank you, Harland. I now call to order the fifty-seventh day of the Ninety-Second Legislature, Second Session. Roll call.

**CLERK:** There's a quorum present, Mr. President.

**SPEAKER BAACK:** Are there any corrections to the Journal?

**CLERK:** No corrections, Mr. President.

**SPEAKER BAACK:** Do you have items for the record?

**CLERK:** I have no items at this time, Mr. President.

**SPEAKER BAACK:** We will proceed to Item 5 on the agenda and LR 429 by Senator Hillman.

**SPEAKER BAACK:** Senator Hillman.

**SENATOR HILLMAN:** Mr. Speaker, members, I bring a resolution today for your support that has to do with economic development, a bill which passed last year in the twin city area in Scottsbluff County called Scottsbluff and Gering. It's an exciting project and they are looking at trying to locate a Rocky Mountain rooky baseball league team in the area. You will see that in the whereases here of this amendment...or this resolution that it is the Arizona Class A Instructional League that's being moved to Colorado, Wyoming and Nebraska and there's a lot of major leagues that are involved in this particular class and league. And it will mean economically some things that they have done. It could have an impact of one and one-half million dollars to the community. They have a baseball field there called Cleveland Baseball Field which is in need of some upgrading although it is good. And the communities have
